COVID-19 update: 80 per cent state-wide settings

As of Friday 29 October at 6:00pm, Metropolitan Melbourne and regional Victoria are subject to the same state-wide settings under Phase C of the Roadmap: Delivering the National Plan.

The new settings include eased density and capacity limits, if workers and customers are fully vaccinated.

If workers and customers are not fully vaccinated with two doses, or venues do not check vaccination status, premises in regional Victoria may be forced to close, or operate with reduced capacity limits.

At 90 per cent, Phase D, on around Wednesday 24 November

- · Capacity limits or density quotients will be removed for all settings.
- Masks will only be mandatory indoors in some high-risk settings such as hospitals, aged care, public transport and justice and correctional facilities.

Vaccination protects you, your family and those in the community who are unable to get vaccinated for medical reasons. We encourage everyone to get vaccinated as soon as possible.

Businesses must verify their customers' vaccination status. If the customer has uploaded their COVID-19 Digital Certificate to their Service Victoria app, you will be able to see their vaccination status together with their check-in details.

Update about Victoria's International Student Arrivals Plan

International students will start returning to Victoria by the end of 2021 under the Victorian Government's International Student Arrivals Plan, which has been endorsed by the Australian

Government.

The plan was developed in consultation with Victorian universities, and industry peak bodies from across the international education sector, including the Independent Tertiary Education Council Australia, the International Higher Education Association, Victorian TAFE Association, Universities Australia, and English Australia and Asia Pacific Student Accommodation.

Under the first stage of the plan, to commence in December 2021, a limited number of places will be available each week for students of Victorian universities who need to urgently return to do practical work, including health and medical and also postgraduate research students.

The second stage of the plan will expand to include more students, including those who are enrolled with other education providers such as TAFEs, English-language colleges, private education providers and secondary schools.

Timing for the second stage is expected to start in early 2022. This and other details, such as how many students can arrive, will depend on Australia's international borders and progress in relation to the <u>national plan to transition Australia's COVID-19 response</u>.

Workers in Victoria who are self-isolating while waiting for a COVID-19 test result can apply for a \$450 COVID-19 Test Isolation Payment, which provides financial support to those who cannot earn an income while they self-isolate

Requirement for overseas and interstate licence holders to convert to a Victorian licence within six months of residing in Victoria

VicRoads has provided important information about Victorian driver licence requirements. Please share with your international students who may be impacted.

In October 2019, a change in the law required all overseas driver licence holders (irrespective of the type of visa held) and interstate licence holders to obtain a Victorian licence within 6 months of residing in Victoria. This requirement, which was suspended due to the impacts of COVID-19, has now recommenced.

Each driver will have unique circumstances and are encouraged to use VicRoads <u>online tool</u> to calculate the date by which they need to convert to a Victorian licence.

Overseas and interstate licence holders who wish to convert to a Victorian licence are encouraged to act now to ensure they have enough time to make any appointments necessary to complete all requirements before their conversion date.

Until their conversion due date, interstate and overseas drivers can continue to use their interstate or overseas licence to drive in Victoria as long as it is still valid.

Vietnam — Expression of Interest – Establishment of a centre for Teacher Education and School Leadership



Vinschool, a Vietnamese leading bilingual school system, is looking to establish a centre for Teacher Education and School Leadership in Hanoi. Vinschool is seeking consultation and content development services from Victorian providers to set up the foundation of the centre and deliver high-quality training to upskill Vietnamese teachers and school leaders. This is an excellent opportunity to provide services for a large Vietnamese private school group.

Vinschool education system consists of

• 13 primary schools

- 10 secondary schools
- 25 kindergartens.

The centre aims to train teachers in the Vinschool system and the broader Vietnamese teacher and school leader network. The centre will be based in Hanoi but will also offer online courses and act as an R&D hub that supports high-quality teaching and school improvement underpinned by evidence-based education. Vinschool requires two service types:

- Consultation services for system-level education design, including a high-quality teaching and learning framework and resources necessary for setting up the centre for Teacher Education and School Leadership
- Content for professional learning and development (PLD) for local teachers and school leaders.
