Proudly supported by Study Melbourne, Future Forte saw its biggest attendance to date, with 245 participants from 46 different countries coming together to raise the visibility of women and gender diverse international students through thought provoking, engaging and inspiring panels, presentations and workshops.

Exciting engagements at Study Melbourne Hubs around the world

Throughout August and September, our global network of Study Melbourne Hubs ran exciting events to engage with students around the world, including:

- Study Melbourne Hub Kuala Lumpur launched <u>Career Ignite</u>, a program for aspiring graduates to be mentored by experienced professionals on a transformative journey towards professional development and growth. Sixty mentees and 30 mentors gathered for a panel discussion about 'Future Careers', where mentees gained valuable insights from the panelists on the importance of having skills such as developing a meaningful network and overcoming challenges as they embark on their career journeys.
- Study Melbourne Hub Ho Chi Minh City held a Back to School Gathering, which welcomed a group of 18 participants, who had the opportunity to hear from a Melbourne alumnus about life as an international student in Victoria, and to participate in fun activities such as learning new Aussie slang and morse decoding.
- Study Melbourne Hub Shanghai hosted a Yoga Night event, where 20 prospective students and alumni gathered to partake in a memorable experience that combined yoga exercise, mindfulness and the promotion of healthy living.

Beware of scams targeting Chinese international students

Recently, there has been a rise in scams targeting the Mandarin-speaking community, particularly Chinese students. These typically involve the scammer (speaking in Mandarin) pretending to be a Chinese authority figure and threatening to extradite students to China unless money is paid. Sometimes, the scams also involve victims staging their own kidnapping at the demand of the scammer to extort money from the victim's family.



Keep yourself safe by learning more about these scams on <u>our website</u> and on the <u>Victoria Police website</u>. There are guides written in Mandarin and English.

Gig Workers' Hub

Gig workers now have a place in the heart of Melbourne where you can take a break and access essential amenities.

The Gig Workers' Hub is a warm comfortable place where you can charge your phone, use the kitchenette and bathroom, and get free snacks and bike lights. The Hub also provides information about gig work to support your safety and wellbeing.

The International Student Lounge Geelong

Supported by Study Melbourne, the International Student Lounge Geelong

—located on 237 Malop Street,

Geelong—provides a dedicated and inclusive space for post-secondary international students living and studying in Geelong, where they can learn about their new environment and culture.

The Lounge Drop-in Centre is open on Monday and Thursday from 5pm- 8pm, and includes a free, healthy hot meal.



The Lounge also features an engaging program of fun activities and information sessions covering issues relevant to international students, to support their physical, emotional and mental health needs.

Legal help at Study Melbourne Hub



The International Student Employment and Accommodation Legal Service (ISEALS) provides free and confidential legal advice to international students located anywhere in Victoria about their employment and accommodation rights. The service is available online or in-person at the Study Melbourne Hub, Victoria. We assist students with issues like:

- Underpayment
- · Bullying and discrimination
- · Injury at work
- Sexual harassment
- Unfairly being fired, or forced to quit your job
- Being engaged as an independent contractor
- Rental properties that fall below standard
- · Issues with bond and rent
- Changes to renting arrangements

Students can contact the <u>Study Melbourne Hub</u> to make an appointment, and <u>visit</u> <u>the ISEALS webpage</u> for more information and short videos about the service.

Additional support for international students
