Australia joins global education treaty; qualifications to be recognised worldwide



Australia has signed the <u>UNESCO Global Convention on the Recognition of Qualifications concerning Higher Education</u>. It is the world's first-ever higher education treaty designed to ensure that qualifications earned in various countries are recognised internationally. This means that students who get their degrees from Australian education providers will be able to have that qualification recognised in other countries.

In a <u>media release</u> published on 24 January 2023, Australian Education Minister Jason Clare called Australia's participation in the

treaty a "significant education milestone."

"The 1.4 million students who study at our universities each year can now have even greater confidence that their Australian qualification, whether undertaken onshore, offshore or online, will be recognised in other countries, helping them to access higher education abroad, as well as pursue greater employment opportunities." he said.

Australia Awards are prestigious, transformational scholarships and short courses offered to emerging leaders from developing countries for study, research and professional development in Australia and the region so they can return home and contribute to their nations' development, prosperity and resilience.

Australia Awards Scholarships provide opportunities to citizens of participating countries, for full-time undergraduate or postgraduate study at Australian institutions.

All recipients of Australia Awards become part of the <u>Australia Global Alumni</u>, connecting them to Australia and to each other – building an engaged and influential global network of leaders and advocates, and establishing a network of ambassadors for Australia and its first-class education system.

Natalia Piedrahita, the Victoria Government educational consultant in Colombia, was pleased to be a part of the Colfuturo Roadshow which visited six Colombian cities to meet with high potential students and promote Victoria's world-class educational institutions and research capabilities.

Colfuturo is Colombia's premier scholarship program, offering financial aid to Colombian students pursuing postgraduate and doctoral studies abroad.

Four Victorian universities have signed agreements with Colfuturo that include tuition fee reductions, scholarships, and increased funding for English language courses. According to Colfuturo, 438 Colombian students have been selected to attend Victorian universities since the program's inception in 1992.

Through the roadshow, Natalia engaged with candidates and highlighted the quality of Victoria's education institutions as well as its reputation for research excellence.
