

## Identification and proof of age



If you're an international student coming to Melbourne, it's crucial to have the right identification (ID) documents so that you can prove both who you are and how old you are.

If you would prefer not to carry your passport around with you, then a proof of age card is the perfect alternative.



1. Pick up an application form from an approved photo point

- 2. Provide proof of identity documents such as a passport and student identification card
- 3. Get someone that you have known for at least 12 months and who is on the electoral roll to complete the referee declaration
- 4. Get an authorised person, like a Justice of the Peace, to witness you sign the application
- 5. Take your form and proof of identity documents to an approved photo point location to have your photo taken and pay the \$10 application fee.

In around 3 to 4 weeks your proof of age card will arrive in the mail!

## **Tax File Number (TFN)**

A Tax File Number (TFN) is a unique identifier issued by the **Australian** 



**Taxation Office (ATO)** to individuals to administer tax.

Here are three reasons why you require a TFN as an international student:

Here are three reasons why you require a TFN as an international student:

- 1. **A TFN is important if you are going to work.** Not having a TFN when you work will mean that you pay higher taxes.
- 2. **A TFN is also important for banking.** When you open a bank account you will be asked for your Tax File Number. If you do not have one the bank may withhold some of the interest earned on your account.
- 3. A TFN is also useful for lodging a tax return.

There is no cost to apply for a TFN and you can apply once you have arrived in Australia.

**Important:** When you receive your TFN it's important that you keep your TFN and all your personal information secure to prevent identity theft and fraud.

## Question of the month

I am an international student studying in Victoria. My myki is expired. What should I do?

**Answer:** All myki smartcards expire after four years, and a mobile myki expires after two years.

You will need to replace the expired myki.

If your myki has expired, or is due to expire within 60 days, you're entitled to an on-the-spot replacement. Your current balance will be transferred to the new myki, which you can use immediately. If your expired myki is registered, your replacement myki will be registered automatically.

Information on when, where and how to replace a myki that is expired or about to expire, is available on **Public Transport Victoria**.

## Do you have asthma or hayfever?



If you have current, past, or undiagnosed asthma or seasonal hay fever you are at increased risk of thunderstorm asthma.

Thunderstorm asthma is thought to be triggered by a unique combination of high amounts of grass pollen in the air and a certain type of thunderstorm.

You can protect yourself and those in your care by following these simple steps:

- Monitor the epidemic thunderstorm asthma risk forecast on the VicEmergency app
- ◆Don't be outdoors in a storm, especially during the winds that precede them
- Make your preventative medication as directed, even when you're symptom free

## Moving to Australia?

Did you know that prior to arriving on a student visa you must have Overseas Student Health Cover?

Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) is health insurance for international students and their dependents. OSHC helps you meet the costs of medical and hospital care while in Australia.


