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Victoria's International Education Recovery Plan 2025, launched on 6 September 2022, establishes a vision of Victoria as a global leader in education, recognised for quality, innovation and inclusion.

The plan outlines the Victorian Government's goals for the international education sector through to 2025 - to be a leader in student experience and graduate outcomes, to diversify and strengthen its global markets, and to elevate Victoria's global reputation for education excellence.

This month the Jobs and Skills Summit in Canberra saw the Government agree to 36 immediate initiatives to address the skills shortages and strengthen the migration system.

The Australian Government will increase the duration of post study work rights by allowing two additional years of stay for recent graduates with select degrees in areas of verified skills shortages to strengthen the pipeline of skilled labour in Australia. It will extend the relaxation of work restrictions for student and training visa holders until 30 June 2023 to help ease skills and labour shortages.

International education will also benefit from \$36.1 million in additional funding to accelerate visa processing and resolve the visa backlog.

Victoria's International Education Recovery Plan 2025 was launched on 6 September 2022 by the Treasurer and Minister for Trade, Economic Development, and Industrial Relations, Tim Pallas MP. The Plan establishes a vision of Victoria as a global leader in education, recognised for quality, innovation and inclusion. The plan sets out five pillars and 19 actions to deliver on this vision, along with critical success factors to 2025 and beyond.

Supported by \$52.9 million in funding, the Plan highlights the worldwide opportunities and connections that Victoria's international education sector offers – including the expansion of the Victorian government's Global Education Network to 19 locations worldwide.

The plan has a focus on education excellence, student experience and graduate outcomes, delivering students a return on investment and launching global careers.

The plan also calls for collective investment in education innovation and technology to ensure the sector can adapt to future shifts in teaching and learning demands.

The University of Melbourne is ranked the top university in Australia



The 2022 Academic Ranking of World Universities (ARWU) report has just been released and ranked the University of Melbourne as Australia's top university. Two Victorian universities were named in the top 100 and five Victorian universities were named in the top 500.

Launched in 2003, the ARWU ranks more than 1,200 universities using six indicators, including number of alumni and staff winning Nobel Prizes and Fields Medals, the number of highly cited researchers selected by Clarivate Analytics, and the number of articles published in peerreviewed journals such as Nature and Science.

Victoria's Skilled Migration Program is now open



Open to applicants living in Victoria and overseas, Live in Melbourne's program provides skilled migrants with a pathway to permanent residency in Victoria. The skills that successful applicants bring to Victoria benefit employers and the broader Victorian economy.

As with previous years, applicants will first need to submit a Registration of Interest (ROI) and then be selected on competitive merit to apply for visa nomination.

Before submitting a ROI, applicants should ensure that they meet all eligibility requirements:

- Skilled Nominated visa (subclass 190)
- Skilled Work Regional (Provisional) visa (subclass 491)

ROIs will be assessed until May 2023.

Printing small, light-weight metals for space

Researchers from Deakin University in Victoria are developing a unique manufacturing process which allows 3D printers to produce miniaturised, light weight metal parts and components onboard spacecrafts or in low-gravity environments such as the moon.

The process, developed in partnership with Virginia Tech in the United States and 3D printing pioneer MELD Manufacturing, uses scrap metal to print new metal parts and components without melting it, offering stronger and better-quality parts.

While they were here, the delegation was keen to engage with some locally based students, and on 24 August, Global Victoria hosted an interactive session with 22 Indian students (current students and recent graduates) where the students were able to share their experiences of studying in Victoria, their employment outcomes, and their future plans.
