STUDENT ARRIVALS

International students to gradually return to Victoria from the end of 2021

International students will start arriving in Victoria by the end of 2021 under the Victorian Government's International Student Arrivals Plan, which has been endorsed by the Australian Government.

The Victorian Government is working with universities to commence the first stage of the plan, which will prioritise students at Victorian universities who urgently need to return for practical work, such as health and medical students and postgraduate research students.

Universities will select enrolled students who can return to Victoria. If you are a student visa holder enrolled with a Victorian university, please wait for your university to contact you. If you have not been contacted, it means you have not been selected yet.

The second stage of the plan will expand to include more students, including those who are enrolled with other education providers such as TAFEs, English-language colleges, private education providers and secondary schools. More information about stage two will be available soon.

Support for international students

Requirement for overseas licence holders to convert to a Victorian licence within six months of residing in Victoria

VicRoads has provided important information about Victorian driver licence requirements.

In October 2019, a change in the law required all overseas driver licence holders (irrespective of the type of visa held) to obtain a Victorian licence within 6 months of residing in Victoria. This requirement, which was suspended due to the impacts of COVID-19, has now recommenced.

Each driver will have unique circumstances and are encouraged to use VicRoads online tool to calculate the date by which they need to convert to a Victorian licence.

International students who wish to convert to a Victorian licence are encouraged to act now to ensure they have enough time to make any appointments necessary to complete all requirements before their conversion date.

Until their conversion due date, international students can continue using their overseas licence to drive in Victoria as long as it is still valid.
