Peer worker project provides crucial mental health support for international students



The Study Melbourne Inclusion Program is proud to support Elvis Martin - an international student mental health peer worker, using his experience to help other international students living in Melbourne.

Elvis's role is part of a pilot project led by youth mental health organisation Orygen in partnership with higher education provider Melbourne Polytechnic and RMIT.

Since November, Mr Martin has raised awareness of mental health within the international student community at Melbourne Polytechnic, and helped students connect with this support when they need it.

Orygen's Associate Director, Employment and Education Partnerships, Gina Chinnery, said the project's goal was to reach up to 100 international students experiencing mental health challenges.

University roundtable with the High Commissioner of Malaysia to **Australia**



Study Melbourne was proud to host His Excellency Dato' Roslan Abdul Rahman, High Commissioner of Malaysia to Australia, for a university roundtable on 10 March.

As part of the High Commissioner's first official visit to Melbourne, the roundtable was an opportunity for Victorian universities to learn about the education opportunities with Malaysia.

With nearly 12,000 Malaysian students enrolled with Victorian education providers in 2020, Malaysia is Victoria's largest international education market in Southeast Asia and fourth-largest overall.

The roundtable reaffirmed the long-standing commitment that many Victorian universities have to the Malaysian market. The High Commissioner and our universities expressed a shared interest in further developing Victoria-Malaysia education and research partnerships and increased twoway student mobility.

Study Melbourne Online Teacher Training Showcase



Study Melbourne, in partnership with FutureLearn, has curated a selection of 10 online modules for schoolteachers in Southeast Asia. The project is promoting Victoria's strengths in teacher

education and as a world-class study destination.

Courses cover topics such as teaching children with additional needs, using storytelling as a teaching tool, flipped teaching, and communicating in English.

The Showcase has seen more than 5,000 enrolments from 138 countries, with the highest number of enrolments from India, the Philippines, Thailand, Indonesia and Vietnam.


