Industry Roundtable to Improve International Student Employment Outcomes

The Victorian Government, through Study Melbourne, is committed to boosting global career outcomes for international students studying with Victoria.

On 25 May, Study Melbourne hosted a roundtable on international student employment at Investment Centre Victoria. Co-chaired by the Hon. John Brumby AO, Chair <u>International Education Advisory Council</u>, and Mr Simon Phemister, Secretary, Department of Jobs, Precincts and Regions, the roundtable was attended by senior representatives from local and international businesses, industry peak bodies, education providers and government.

With acute skills shortages experienced across Victorian industries and businesses, international students are a major untapped talent pool capable of contributing to knowledge and skills priorities. Business leaders demonstrated a shared commitment to improving employment pathways and outcomes for this talented cohort. Roundtable participants recommended insightful approaches, including offering more quality work experiences to international students during their study, amending recruitment policy and processes, and actively promoting international student capability among industry.

Study Melbourne Research Partnerships stopping the spread of 'fake news'

Launched in October 2021, the Study Melbourne Research Partnerships program provides \$2.8 million in funding for major research projects between Victorian education providers and international partners. One of the partnerships, between Deakin University and Gadjah Mada University, looks at tackling misinformation.

Since the beginning of the global pandemic, COVID-19 information has spread around the world through mass media and social platforms, creating what authorities term an 'infodemic'. Unfortunately, not all information is accurate or trustworthy. Some are even categorised as 'fake news'.

Deakin University and Gadjah Mada University in Indonesia will use a computational-based detection, machine learning, and human factor engineering approach to design a decision support system that functions as a warning mechanism for misinformation related to COVID-19. The final tool is being developed for use by organisations and governments in developing appropriate communications and education strategies.

Study Melbourne was proud to host Her Excellency Busadee Santipitaks, Ambassador of Thailand to Australia, on Friday 23 May. As part of the visit, the Ambassador met with representatives from Victorian universities at a roundtable, providing an opportunity for universities to learn about the education opportunities in Thailand.

The Ambassador visited Kangan Institute and William Angliss Institute, to learn more about Victoria's VET capabilities in the auto manufacturing and hospitality and tourism areas, both of which are major contributors to the Thai economy.



Following a visit to Monash University, the Ambassador also met with representatives from RMIT University, and the Victorian Department

of Environment, Land, Water and Planning, to discuss areas of collaboration in the green energy and circular economy space.


