Get vaccinated

The COVID-19 vaccine reduces the risk of you and your workers getting seriously ill with COVID-19.

The more Victorians who get vaccinated through the COVID-19 vaccine rollout, the faster we can move towards reopening our state's businesses and industry.

If you're yet to be vaccinated, book your appointment today. If have any questions or concerns you can talk to a GP, or pharmacist.

All Victorians are encouraged where possible to book their vaccination at <u>portal.cvms.vic.gov.au</u> or by phoning the Coronavirus hotline on 1800 675 398.

Vaccine mandates for industry

In order to work, all staff in schools and early childhood services will be required to have a first dose by 18 October or have a booking within one week, with full vaccination required by 29 November unless a medical exemption applies – including in government and non-government schools and all types of early childhood and care settings.

International Student Arrivals



The Victorian Government has been working closely with education providers on the International Student Arrivals Plan to allow the gradual return of international students to Victoria.

The plan has been submitted to the Australian Government for consideration and if endorsed will create a safe pathway for a limited number of international students to arrive in Victoria each week.

Under the first stage of the plan, 120 places will be available each week. These places will be prioritised for university students who urgently need to return to Victoria to do practical work, including health and medical students, and postgraduate research students.

The second stage of the plan will expand to include more students, including those who are enrolled with other education providers such as TAFEs, English-language colleges, private education providers and secondary schools. More information about stage two will be available soon.

Universities will select enrolled students who can return to Victoria under the first stage of the plan. There is no application process.

Student selection will begin after the Australian Government has confirmed its support for the plan.

2021 Academic Ranking of World Universities (ARWU)



The 2021 Academic Ranking of World Universities (ARWU) was released 18 August.

The ranking methodology is based on indicators such as the number of alumni and staff winning Nobel Prizes and Fields Medals, the number of articles published in journals of Nature and Science, the number of articles indexed in Science Citation Index, and per capita academic performance of an institution.

The headline from last year still remains: six Victorian universities are in the Top 400 (this has been the case since 2018).

A notable congratulations to The University of Melbourne (#33) and Monash University (#80) which were listed in the Top 100.

International Education Resilience Fund



The Victorian Government has announced a new \$50 million International Education Resilience Fund to support Victorian universities and international students respond to impacts of COVID-19 and position Victoria's university sector for recovery.

The International Education Resilience Fund will support Victorian universities through funding for increased international student welfare and support services, improved delivery of remote and offshore teaching and learning, and increased student engagement initiatives.

This support builds on the Government's unprecedent investment in Victoria's international education sector during the pandemic, including an additional \$50.9 million announced in the 2021-22 State Budget and \$33.4 million <u>International Education Short-Term Recovery Plan</u> released in 2020.

Thunderstorm Asthma preparedness
