Reminder: Unrestricted work rights for student visa holders to end on 30 June 2023

Due to workforce shortages, the Australian Government temporarily relaxed student visa work limits for all sectors of the economy.

From 30 June 2023, the number of hours that an international student can work during the academic year will again be capped. Students can continue to work unlimited hours during study breaks.

Question of the month

As an international student, how can I get advice about renting/landlords/bonds and my rights as a tenant?

Answer: Accommodation issues can be stressful. If you need advice about your situation, speak to the team at the **Study Melbourne Student Centre**.

At the Student Centre, the International Student Employment and Accommodation Legal Service can provide advice about rent increases, your bond, the condition of your property, or any other aspect of your tenancy. The service offers free advice to international students renting in Victoria, to support you when renting gets complicated.

Flood Support Package for eligible international students

Flood hardship support is a Victorian Government funded financial payment for temporary visa holders (including international students) who are experiencing financial hardship and whose work has been impacted by recent floods in Victoria.

This support is for people who do not have access to Commonwealth income support (including SRSS, Special Benefits and Job Seeker) or the Victorian Government's Personal Hardship Assistance Program (PHAP).

Once your application is assessed, eligible single people can receive up to \$580. Families receive more based upon situation and size.
