### **Enjoy Victoria's parks and natural spaces safely**



- 1. When hiking or bushwalking, it's important to plan ahead.
- 2. Pack at least two litres of water, extra food and a first aid kit.
- 3. Bring a fully charged smartphone and take a photo of a map of the area before you leave home.
- 4. It is easy for campfires in Victoria to grow and spread quickly and dangerously. Don't build your own firepit, and only light a campfire in fireplaces provided.
- 5. Do not park on the side of the road when the parks are overcrowded as it obstructs walkways, making it dangerous for everyone.

- 6. Often coastal destinations within 1.5 hours of Melbourne will be full by 10 am. Arrive early or have a backup plan if it is already busy when you arrive.
- 7. Swim safely at beaches, rivers and lakes by learning about the conditions and your ability. If you jump in without a plan, you could drown.

### Are you considering hiring an e-scooter for commercial purposes?



E-scooters are becoming increasingly popular as a mode of transport. If you are planning to hire an e-scooter to help with your role as a food delivery person or to travel between locations, please make sure you familiarise yourself with the following:

- Victorian users can only ride in participating council areas
- The speed limit is 20 km/h
- You must wear a helmet at all times
- To operate an e-scooter, your Blood Alcohol Concentration (BAC) must be below 0.05%.

Warning: offending whist riding a commercial hire e-scooter may result in loss of any driver licence or permit held.
