# Important announcement from the Australian Government – post study work rights changes



From 1 July 2023, international higher education graduates with eligible qualifications will be granted an extra two years of post-study work rights. The allowable work hours cap for international students will also be increased from 40 hours to 48 hours per fortnight.

Post-study work rights for international graduates will be increased from:

- 2 years to 4 years for select bachelor degrees
- 3 years to 5 years for select master degrees
- · 4 years to 6 years for all doctoral degrees.

A two-year extension of post-study work rights is available for international graduates with select degrees that are in areas of verified skill shortage. View the indicative list of eligible occupations in demand and the related qualifications which are eligible for the extension.

The extension is in addition to the existing additional one to two years of work rights for eligible students who study, live and work in regional areas.

#### Jakarta - BRIN-Victoria Research and Innovation



The Victorian Government, through Global Victoria, delivered the BRIN-Victoria Research and Innovation Forum in Jakarta from 21-22 February.

The Forum, which is the first engagement of its kind between Australia and BRIN (Indonesia's National Research and Innovation Agency), was an outstanding success, with over 420 participants joining over the 2 days.

The Forum was delivered in partnership with BRIN and was a key opportunity for Victorian universities to showcase their higher degree research programs.

Victoria's Lead Scientist, Dr. Amanda Caples, led a delegation from Deakin University, Monash University, RMIT University, Swinburne University and The University of Melbourne.

Participants heard from BRIN and Victorian researchers on research areas of strategic mutual interest, including environment and marine biosciences, health, aerospace, advanced manufacturing and energy.

The Forum also provided opportunities for Victorian university representatives to engage with BRIN researchers interested in undertaking a higher degree research program with an international partner under BRIN's Degree By Research Scholarship Program.

# Growing education partnership between India and Australia – building of Australian university campuses and qualification mechanisms



Deakin will become the first university in the world to open an international teaching campus in India.

Deakin University will open its state-of-theart campus in India by mid-2024. The campus will be located in the heart of the smart business district, Gujarat International Finance Tec-City (GIFT City) and will offer students the opportunity to study cyber security and business analytics. 41% of Indian students choose Victoria as their study destination of choice and the new Deakin University campus will pave a new way for Indian students to obtain an Australian education by bringing it closer.

#### RMIT University expands into India with partnership

The Birla Institute of Technology and Science, Pilani (BITS) and RMIT have partnered to deliver the first dual degree program between India and Australia.

Commencing in mid-2023, the BITS-RMIT Higher Education Academy (The Academy) aims to provide high-quality transnational education to Indian students and facilitate significant regional collaboration with India. The Academy will initially offer four undergraduate engineering programs where students will begin their learning at BITS followed by two years at RMIT in Melbourne with potential for a career in Australia or India.

### The University of Melbourne launches Bachelor of Science dual degree with major Indian universities

Indian Students are now able to complete a new Bachelor of Science dual degree, following an enhanced partnership between the University of Melbourne and University of Madras, Savitribai Phule Pune University, and Gandhi Institute of Technology and Management (Hyderabad).

This degree allows students to complete their degree at both home and abroad, spending the first two years studying in India, followed by two years on campus in Melbourne. The benefit to students is that this dual degree provides more Indian students with direct pathways to complete their studies.

### Fashion Graduates featured as part of the PayPal Melbourne Fashion **Festival**



Study Melbourne was delighted to feature two international student fashion graduates as part of the Global Victoria Fashion Showcase, in partnership with PayPal Melbourne Fashion Festival.

Yuxi Liu and Canwen Zhao, graduates from the RMIT School of Fashion worked with internationally renowned milliner, Richard Nylon to prepare their designs for the runway. The central theme of their creations was sustainability, and both were thrilled to show their creations alongside other Melbourne designers including first nations designer Ngali, Mastani, Bul, Anrsdorf, Kuwali and A.BCH.
