## Coronavirus (COVID-19) information and support for international students

### Safely reopening Victoria

At 11:59pm on 27 October 2020, changes were made to restrictions in metropolitan Melbourne and regional Victoria. Check coronavirus.vic.gov.au to find out how these changes affect you, and keep up to date with future changes.

The coronavirus (COVID-19) roadmap for reopening provides steps on easing restrictions, dependent on how many active coronavirus (COVID-19) cases are in the community and public health advice.

International students are important to the Victorian community. We look forward to welcoming overseas students back to Victoria when it is safe to do so. The latest information about travelling to Victoria to commence or continue studies is published on the Study Melbourne website.

### Financial support for international students

The Victorian Government offers emergency financial assistance to international students.

#### **International Student Emergency Relief Fund**

- The Victorian Government has helped more than 31,000 students through the Fund with a one-off support of up to \$1100.
- · Applications are still open.
- The one-off support is available for eligible students who have lost wages and work due to coronavirus (COVID-19) and meet all other eligibility criteria.
- · Bridging Visa holders (A and B) can now apply.

#### Free meals and groceries for international students

International students who are struggling to pay for their food and groceries can access free and healthy food at Foodbank's International Student Pop-Up Store. The Victorian Government has provided \$1 million in funding to SecondBite, Foodbank Victoria and OzHarvest to provide free food and meals to international students in Victoria who are doing it tough.

#### **Extreme Hardship Support Program**

Students who can't access the International Student Emergency Relief Fund may be eligible for financial assistance through Victoria's Extreme Hardship Support Program. Find out how to apply through the Red Cross.

#### **Test Isolation Support**

Victorian workers can apply for a \$450 Coronavirus (COVID-19) Test Isolation Support that provides financial support while they self-isolate to wait for the results of a coronavirus (COVID-19) test. International students can apply for this financial support. Find out more about the \$450 Coronavirus (COVID-19) Test Isolation Support.

#### **Further Support**

In addition, international students in Victoria can access other Victorian Government support including:

- one-off rent relief grants of up to \$3000 for people in rental hardship due to the pandemic
- utility relief grants to help pay overdue bills
- help to find work through Working for Victoria
- a dedicated coronavirus (COVID-19) online support hub on the Study Melbourne website
- a directory of <u>community support and food relief</u>
- access to free legal advice on accommodation and employment issues.

# **Services Spotlight**



### **Study Melbourne Student Centre**

The Study Melbourne Student Centre building is still temporarily closed but our staff continue to work online and over the phone to provide case management support and information referral services for international students on a wide range of issues. This includes mental health support and free legal advice on employment and accommodation matters. Resources at the centre have been enhanced to help meet the unprecedent demand for support from students, including increased capacity to provide case management and emergency assistance. #### Mental Health Advice Line for Education Sector Staff

The Victorian Government is working with Orygen – a specialist mental health provider for young people - to provide practical mental health consultation to counselling and wellbeing staff supporting international students in Victoria.

Orygen's advice line will provide counselling and wellbeing staff with an opportunity to debrief and discuss any issues of concern and seek professional advice on how to refer international students to mental health services.

The clinical advice will be provided by senior clinicians from Orygen who have strong experience in delivering positive approaches to the prevention and treatment of mental disorders in young people.
