If you are facing hardship, you may be eligible for financial assistance through the
Victorian Government's Extreme Hardship Support Program. The program is available
to eligible international students in Victoria, including people who received a payment
through the International Student Emergency Relief Fund. Learn how to apply through
the Red Cross website.

The International Student Emergency Relief Fund supported more than 33,000 international students who faced financial hardship through lost wages and work as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. The fund gave a one-off payment of up to \$1100 and was delivered in partnership with Victoria's tertiary education providers. Applications closed on 31 December 2020.

Coronavirus (COVID19) Test Isolation Support

Workers in Victoria can apply for a \$450 Coronavirus (COVID-19) Test Isolation Payment, which provides financial support while they self-isolate to wait for the results of a COVID-19 test.

Other support for international students in Victoria

Other support for international students in Victoria includes:

- free groceries at the Foodbank International Student Pop-Up Store in central Melbourne - open until the end of March 2021
- help to find work through Working for Victoria
- one-off rent relief grants of up to \$3,000 for people in rental hardship due to the pandemic
- · utility relief grants to help pay overdue bills
- a dedicated coronavirus (COVID-19) support hub
- free legal advice on accommodation and employment matters
- confidential support and practical help through the Study Melbourne Student Centre.



Free groceries and meals for international students in Victoria

The Victorian Government has awarded a total of \$1.35m in funding to SecondBite, Foodbank Victoria and OzHarvest to provide free food and meals to international students in Victoria who are doing it tough.

International students struggling to pay for their food and groceries can access free and healthy food at Foodbank's International Student Pop-Up Store in the CBD, open until the end of March 2021. Subscribe
